There was no pathway



that connected both sides of the bay.



A bridge was built over the river



to solve this problem.



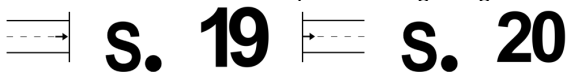
The bridge was remodelled later.

only women were allowed to bathe on this beach.



The men had to go to Port Bo, or Port Pelegrí.
